






History of the Forum

- Strategic Study of Groundwater Issues and Research Needs in the UK - report published June 1995
- Forum promoted a coordinated approach to groundwater research and provided a focus for the identification and prioritisation of research issues
- June 2003, it was decided that the Forum would be more effective if it limited its focus to raising the awareness of groundwater






